The Colorado State High School Rodeo Association will follow the National High School Rodeo Association Rule Book. The following guidelines are clarifications Colorado will follow for their state Rodeos.

Guidelines:

Point Systems

High School Division -

The points needed to qualify for National High School Rodeo Finals are earned at state sanctioned rodeos and the state finals. State sanctioned rodeos are held during the fall and spring. Colorado High School Rodeo Finals are held in June. Remembering that each day is an individual and separate rodeo. In Colorado, average points are awarded only at the State Finals Rodeo, not during the regular rodeo season.

For the regular season you count your top 10 rodeos regardless of how many rodeo's you placed at and/or competed in. A contestant may carry a maximum of 100 points into State Finals in anyone event. Points are earned 1st through 10th places, with 1st being worth 10 points, 2nd worth 9 points through 10th place which is worth 1 point. You could earn 10 first places and have a total of 100 points. Example: If you had 4 firsts, 3 second's, and 3 third's you would have to get a place higher than third to increase your point total.

You will take points earned at your top 10 rodeos to the state finals. At the state finals you will compete in 2 go-rounds. Each round is worth the same as a regular season rodeo, 10 points through 1 point. Points earned at your top 10 rodeos are added to the points earned at the first 2 rounds of the finals. If you are one of the top 15 places (including ties) you go the final Championship Round. The championship round carries the same point value as regular season. Average points will then be awarded to the average winner in each event based on their total time/score on Round 1, Round 2, and Championship Round, 10 points through 1 point.

Summary: (Best 10 regular + state finals round 1 + state finals round 2 + championship round + average points on three head) = Total Points. Top 4 goes to National Finals, 5 thru 10 qualify for Silver State.

All Around Points:

All points won based on a 10-point system will count towards All Around Cowboy/Cowgirl. The high point contestant placing in two or more events will have precedence over one who places in one event for All Around Cowboy/Cowgirl.

Entry Fees:

High School Division

Bulls, Barebacks, Saddle Bronc, Cutting - \$35.00 per event

Calf Roping, Breakaway, Steer Wrestling - \$30.00 per event

Barrels, Poles, Goat Tying, Team Roping (ea) - \$25.00 per event

\$15.00 of the entry fees is jackpot fees, balance is to the rodeo committee

PLUS - a one-day office fee of \$15.00 per day per contestant

-break out is \$10.00 state fee, \$3.00 judges fee, and \$2.00 for Scholarships.

If applicable - a \$10.00 per day per contestant Independent Fee if you are not a member of a current club.

Ground Money

If there are no qualified rides or times in any single event at a CSHSRA Rodeo,

The jackpot monies in that event will be paid out equally to all contestants entered in that event at that rodeo as Ground Money

Uncashed Checks

All monies from checks not cashed by July 19th of the rodeo year will be forfeited by the member and those monies will be deposited into the CSHSRA Scholarship Fund and will no longer be available to the original recipient as prize money.

Replacement of Lost Jackpot Checks

Checks will be replaced up to 30 days after issue. Payee will pay for the stop payment of the check to be replaced. (\$40.00 stop payment and \$2.00 for new check fee)

Rodeo Secretary / Central Entry

CSHSRA has a central entry set up to enter the rodeos. You **MUST** call **CENTRAL ENTRY**, **NOT** the contact person for that rodeo, and **NOT** the state board or secretary. Central entry is where you call the same person or number each time you want to enter a rodeo.

1. Call in days: Wednesday and Thursdays (9th and 10th day prior to Rodeo)

2. Call in times: 7:00pm-9:00pm Please check the time before you call as these numbers will not be answered before or after the stated times. Entries left on the recorder other than at these specified days & times will be considered as Late Entries. Late Entries are subject to additional fees. If you have questions regarding a specific rodeo, stalls, camping, directions, etc., check the website and/or contact the published sponsor of that rodeo.

3. To enter you will need to give:

- a. Your name
- b. Your CSHSRA card number
- c. Events you want to enter
- d. Rodeo you are entering (i.e. Lamar # 1 and Lamar # 2 or one specific rodeo)

4. Entry secretary will give you a confirmation number. You must have this number if there is a problem with your entry. With out a confirmation number you will not have a case to argue.

5. Team Ropers---Notice!!!

- a. When you enter advise if you head or heel and partners name.
- b. You may not enter your partner. He/She must call to enter themselves.
- c. You Can Not enter without a partner.

6. Draw outs:

Call 1-970-653-0122 **USE THIS NUMBER ONLY** or Email!!!!

If it is necessary for you to draw out you must call central entry before Monday at 5:00 pm prior to the rodeo. For high school call 1-970-653-0122 do not call any other numbers this is the only one with a recorder. This number will have a messaging center that will date and time stamp the message you leave. Please be specific as to what event and/or rodeo you are drawing out of, i.e. all events or just 1 or 2 and/or which day. If you do not call out you will be liable for all entry fees. When drawing out of a rodeo you are still responsible for paying all office fees.

7. No Show at Rodeo:

If you enter a rodeo and do not show up to compete you are considered a no show and are liable for all your entry fees before you will be allowed to enter/ compete in another rodeo.

8. Late Entries:

The state will allow late entries. It is very expensive to do this. You can call between Friday and Monday until 5:00pm. You will NOT get entered in or drawn out if you call any other numbers. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!!

Leave the following information:

- * Specify if Draw-out or Late Entry
- * Name (John Smith)
- * Phone Number (Phone number is ***-***-*****)
- * Card Number (Card Number *****)
- * Day (Sat., Sun., or Both)
- * Events (barrels)
- * Name again (John Smith)

Late Entries will cost you above what you will normally pay:

\$25.00 Flat rate per weekend and \$10.00 per event per day

If you are already entered in the rodeo and you are adding an event the \$10.00 per event per day will apply.

Bad Checks:

- 1st offense - amount of check + \$20.00 fee.
- 2nd offense - amount of check + \$20.00 (amount to be paid in cash). From this point on checks will not be accepted from those individuals.

Bring to each Rodeo for entry:

Fees must be paid before you participate in your 1st event. Failure to do so will be a disqualification for that rodeo in all events..

- 1) Entry Money
- 2) Your membership card.
- 3) Your Back number.

DUES / MEMBERSHIPS:

- 1) Club Dues are due August 20th of each year. Any changes to adult sponsors must be given to State Secretary immediately.

2) Contestant Membership dues are due into the state by August 15th or 2 weeks prior to CALL IN to assure paper work would be done in time.

3) Club members names are to be given to state secretary 2 weeks prior to CALL IN to assure paper work would be done in time.

Timers / Judges / Flag Person

In order to improve the overall quality of Colorado high school rodeos, a certification program has been established for Judges and Timers.

1) Judges must be certified through the CSHSRA judges program. Any rodeo failing to use CSHSRA certified judges, and using a judge or flag person with an immediate family contesting, will forfeit all reimbursement by the State for judge's fees. Judges/flag person shall not officiate an event in which a member of their immediate family is contesting. (Immediate Family = Mother, Father, Sister, Brother)

2) Timers must be competent. The CSHSRA has a list of competent timers; please use timers from our list.

3) Certified list is available from the CSHSRA board and will be included in in each host committee packet.

4) If no CSHSRA certified personnel are available for a CSHSRA sanctioned rodeo, please contact the Chairman of the Judges and Timers Committee.

Rodeo Officials / Arena Directors:

Absolutely no verbal/physical abuse will be tolerated, from contestants, parents, or others towards ANY CSHSRA Rodeo Official or CSHSRA Board member. Any such behavior by either contestant or parent will be reason for immediate disqualification from that rodeo. Verbal defamation of the Association, Officials and/or Board members will be taken as verbal abuse.

Complaints:

Any and all formal complaints registered must be in written form, dated, signed and turned into the CSHSRA Board.

Host committee must follow all the CSHSRA & NHSRA rules, any violation of these rules will put club on probation and a review of continuing hosting a rodeo in the future.

Vet Release:

You may not vet release. If you have not drawn out by Monday at 5:00 pm (standard draw out time) you are liable for your fees regardless of you situation.

Medical Release:

You may doctor release out with the following stipulations:

- 1) The contestant would miss the next 4 rodeos(each day is a rodeo)
- 2) You must have a written Doctors release stating that you cannot compete in the sport of rodeo, which must be presented to the CSHSRA secretary.
- 3) Before you can participate again in a rodeo you must present to the CSHSRA secretary, a doctor release stating you can compete in your event(s). This must be done BEFORE CALL IN'S to be able to enter and participate again.

Rules per Event:

Calf Roping

- 1) Will be timed to the nearest hundredth
- 2) Sixty second time limit to call for your stock.
- 3) See current NHSRA Rule book

Bareback Riding

- 1) Be ready when your animal is loaded in the chute. 2) See current NHSRA Rule book

Steer Wrestling

- 1) Will be timed to the nearest hundredth
- 2) Sixty second time limit to call for your stock. 3) See current NHSRA Rule book

Bull Riding

- 1) Be ready when your animal is loaded in the chute.
- 2) See current NHSRA Rule book

Saddle Bronc Riding

- 1) Be ready when your animal is loaded in the chute.
- 2) See current NHSRA Rule book

Barrel Racing

- 1) Contestant must be mounted on horse when entering arena for their event
- 2) All contestants must enter from the same gate
- 3) Standard Rake at all rodeos - Pattern will be raked before the event and every seven runs on the approved draw sheet. Rake remains the same position in draw if there are any T/O's.
- 4) All timed events - Sixty Second Time limit to enter arena and begin your run after the gate is opened. This will be at the judge's discretion.
- 5) See current NHSRA Rule book

Pole Bending

- 1) Contestant must be mounted on horse when entering arena for their event
- 2) All contestants must enter from the same gate
- 3) Standard Rake at all rodeos - Pattern will be raked before the event and every seven runs on the approved draw sheet. Rake remains the same position in draw if there are any T/O's.

- 4) All timed events - Sixty Second Time limit to enter arena and begin your run after the gate is opened. This will be at the judge's discretion.
- 5) See current NHSRA Rule book

Breakaway Roping

- 1) Will be timed to the nearest hundredth
- 2) Sixty second time limit to call for your stock.
- 3) See current NHSRA Rule book

Goat Tying

- 1) All contestants must enter from the same gate.
- 2) Event will be timed to the nearest hundredth
- 3) Sixty Second Time limit to enter arena and begin your run after the gate is opened. This will be at the judge's discretion.
- 4) See current NHSRA Rule book

Dally Team Roping

- 1) Will be timed to the nearest hundredth
- 2) Sixty second time limit to call for your stock
- 3) See current NHSRA rule book

Queen Contest

- 1) To be conducted at state finals
 - a. You must be a member in good standing to compete. You do not have to enter any Rodeo's besides state finals.
- 2) See current NHSRA Rule book
